


Our Church History

The Weddington Gap Baptist Church was organized on March 20, 1871 by Elders E. Baker and Elijah Burkett. The deacons elected were John England and George Dickison. Among the first members were H. M. Davis, John T. Davis, Melvina F. Davis, Edward England and J. A. Cooper (the first clerk). In early 1900, Weddington Gap Baptist Church was changed to Weddington Baptist Church.

The Church first met in the Weddington school house and the Methodist church building. In 1889, the first services were held in the new one room church building. In 1955, a new auditorium was added to the first building. In 1979, the current auditorium was completed and the 1955 auditorium became the educational building. At the present time, it is being used for classrooms and the nursery. In 2007, a fellowship hall with classrooms was completed, replacing the first 1889 structure. This building was dedicated to God's service on November 16, 2008.

In 1872, the Church became a member of the Fayetteville Baptist Association (currently named the Baptist Missionary Association of the Ozarks.) Today, the Church also cooperates with the Baptist Missionary Association of Arkansas and the Baptist Missionary Association of America in mission work, publishing literature, supporting Central Baptist College at Conway, AR and the BMAA Theological Seminary at Jacksonville, Texas and the Association of Baptist Students on the campus of University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, AR.
